

STATE OF EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION: AN OVERVIEW OF THE DATA

CHILDREN IN CHILD CARE



- 30% of children 0 to 5 (14% of children 0 to 3) are enrolled in licensed child care.
- 59% in 4 or 5 star care
- 68% of subsidized children in 4 or 5 star care

3 & 4 YEAR OLDS IN CHILD CARE



- Head Start: 254 children
- NC Pre-K: 228 children
- RCS Preschool: 192 children
- Private Childcare: 341 children

AVERAGE STAR RATINGS



- All programs: 4.06 stars
- Programs serving subsidized children: 4.24 stars
- Star ratings for infant/toddler: 3.5 stars (excludes GS-110s)

48.6% OF 3RD GRADE STUDENTS

scored proficient in reading on end of grade tests for school year 2017-2018 in Rockingham County.

Third grade reading scores are a predictor of high school graduation. Students not reading on grade-level by the end of third grade are FOUR times more likely to drop out.
