COMMUNICATE

OUTCOMES

EARLY EDUCATION SERVICES

Provides professional development and coaching to early childhood educators in child care centers and homes and assists with child care program start-ups.

CCR&R BLOCK GRANT

Provides support to early childhood education facilities and school-age care programs through access to regional Infant-Toddler and Behavioral Specialists.

CHILD CARE SUBSIDY

Assists families below 100% of the state median income with the cost of child care.

PARENTS AS TEACHERS

An evidence-based home visiting program for families with children prenatal to kindergarten entry focused on optimizing children's development and supporting families.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH & AWARENESS

Educates the community about RCPC and the needs of young children and their families.

EDUCATION INCENTIVES

Awards cash incentives to early childhood educators completing courses toward an AAS or BA/BS in early childhood education/child development.

CHILD CARE WAGE\$

Provides education-based salary supplements for early childhood educators and directors who are historically underpaid.

NC PRE-KINDERGARTEN

Delivers high quality educational experiences to enhance school readiness for eligible 4-year-old children.

REACH OUT & READ

Through a partnership with medical providers, families with children birth to 5 receive a "prescription" for reading. During their child's well child check-up, children receive an age-appropriate book.

PROGRAM COORDINATION/ EVALUATION

Examines early childhood data to determine community need. Coordinates, evaluates and monitors RCPC programs and services to ensure accountability and model fidelity.

NURSE-FAMILY PARTNERSHIP

Pairs registered nurses with first-time parents to achieve optimal birth, child development and familial outcomes using an evidence-based framework.

ADOLESCENT PARENTING PROGRAM

Supports pregnant and parenting individuals ages 13-20, focusing on education, self-sufficiency, developmental outcomes and delaying a second pregnancy.

DOLLY PARTON'S IMAGINATION LIBRARY

Provides a book by mail each month, at no cost, to enrolled children from birth until their 5th birthday.

KIDSREADY-ROCKINGHAM

Supports community leaders and stakeholders to improve systems operation and outcomes for young children focusing on social-emotional health.

KALEIDOSCOPE PLAY & LEARN

Weekly facilitated playgroups for children, birth to 5 and their caregivers focusing on early literacy and socialemotional development.

CHILD CARE HEALTH CONSULTANT

Promotes healthy and safe environments for children in child care settings through targeted and comprehensive consultation, group training and general resource sharing.
